Indigenous Energy Ownership Tracker (IEOT)



The IEOT is a database and interactive dashboard developed to track and detail Indigenous equity ownership in major resource and energy projects across Canada. It covers all publicly known projects across 5 key sectors - power & utilities, mining, chemicals, CCUS, and oil & gas.

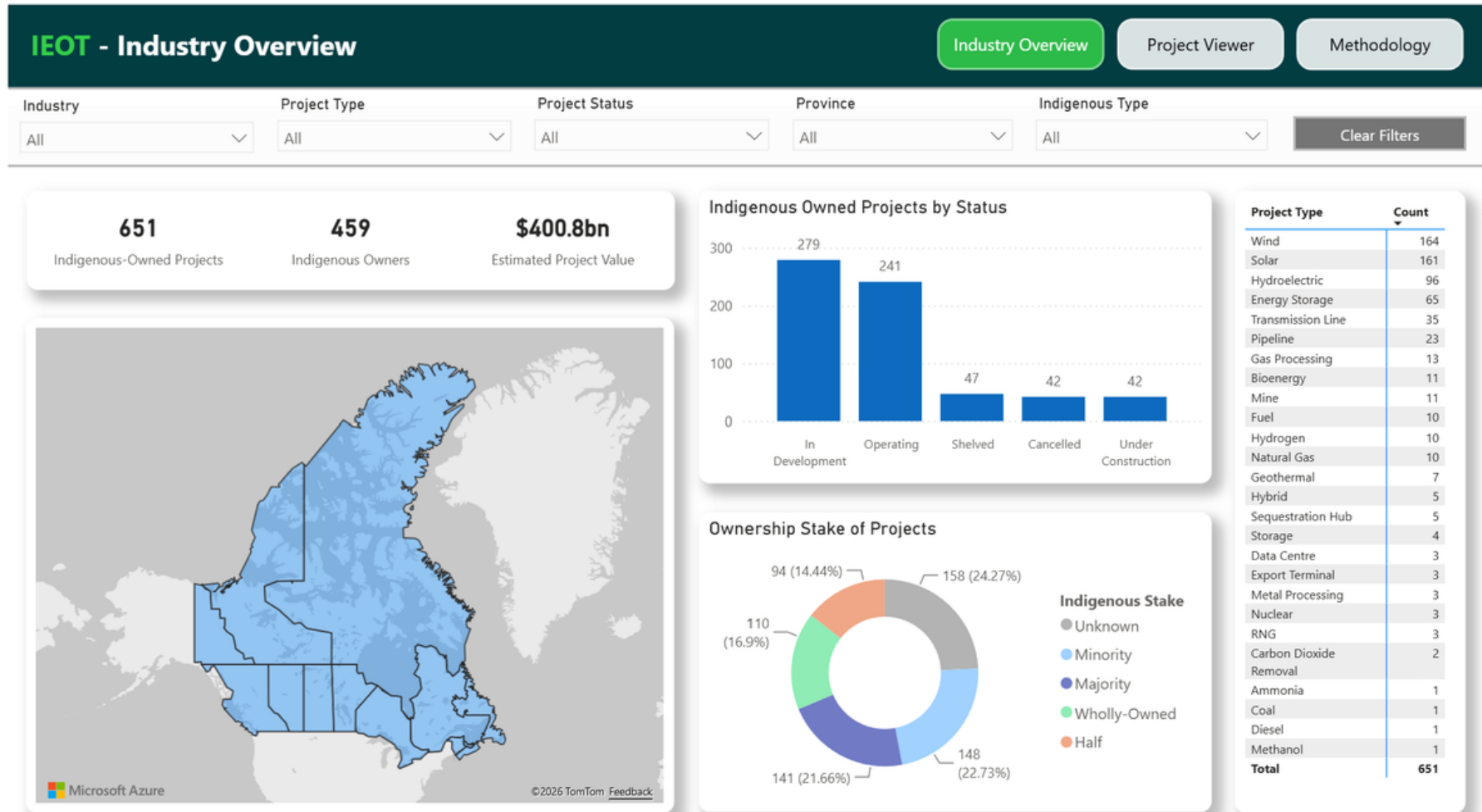

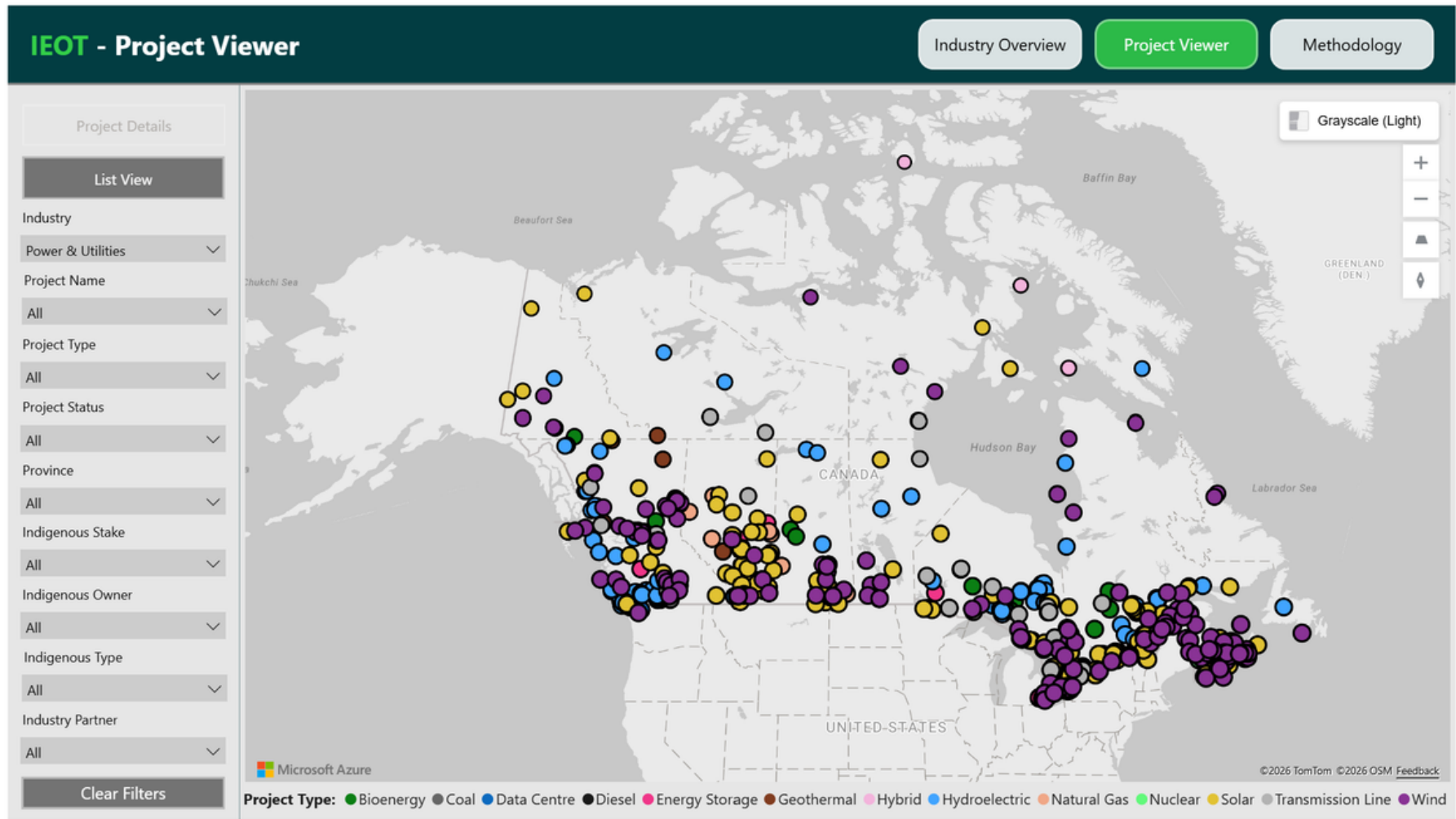

Project Description

The Cedar LNG Project is a proposed floating liquefied natural gas (LNG) facility located near Kitimat, British Columbia, within the traditional territory of the Haisla Nation. This initiative represents a significant milestone as the world's first Indigenous-majority-owned LNG project. It is being developed by the Haisla Nation and Pembina Pipeline Corporation. The facility is designed to produce approximately 3.3 million tonnes per annum of LNG, leveraging Canada's abundant natural gas resources to supply international markets, particularly in Asia. Early construction activities have commenced and operations are expected to begin in late 2028.

Financial Notes

The project is expected to be funded with asset-level debt financing for about 60% of the project cost. Cedar LNG has secured a construction term loan with a syndicate of banks. The remaining 40% will be funded through equity contributions from both partners. The First Nations Finance Authority loaned Haisla \$1.4 billion and has issued its first-ever 30-year bond, raising \$350 million. Export Development Canada will provide a loan of between \$400 - \$500 million as part of a wider lending group. In March 2025, the federal government provided up to \$200 million in support from the Strategic Innovation Fund. In July 2025, the Government of BC provided \$200 million.
